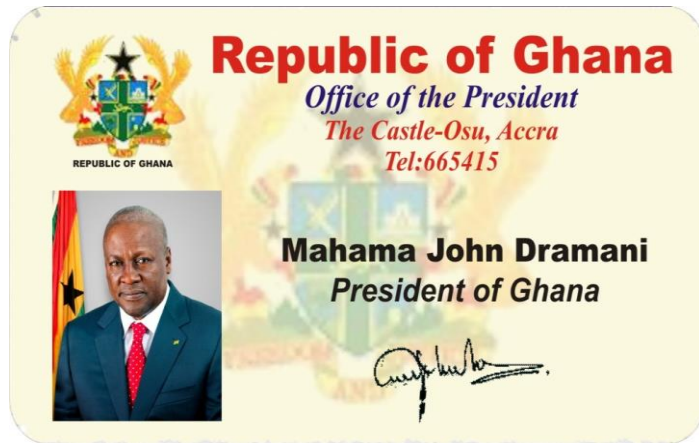

Economics:

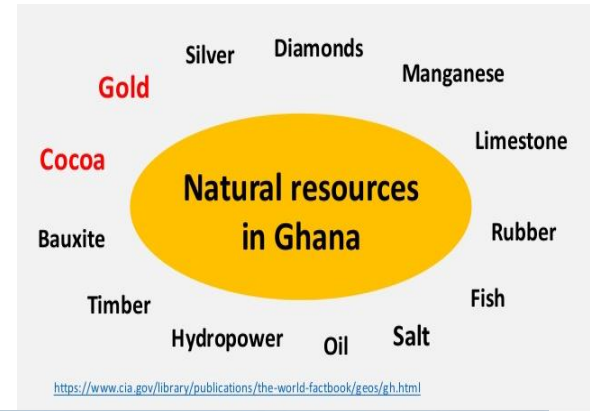
- ❑ Income level = lower middle income
